



**Media Statement – Outbreak over at Stirling Heights Long Term Care Home – Cambridge

We received notice today from Region of Waterloo Public Health Services that the COVID-19 outbreak at Stirling Heights Long Term Care Home in Cambridge is over. The outbreak was declared on January 17 after three staff members tested positive for COVID-19. All cases have now resolved.

We appreciate the support of Region of Waterloo Public Health, our residents and families and the local community as we worked to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the home.

We can assure you that we are not letting our guard down now that this outbreak is over. We will maintain our vigilance, monitoring residents and screening staff and visitors for symptoms. Staff will continue to wear an appropriate mask and eye protection at all times.

We are in the process of reaching out to the families of residents to inform them that the outbreak has been declared over and that no residents were affected.

Vaccinations have begun in Stirling Heights Long Term Care Home. All residents, who have provided consent and are able to be vaccinated, are now receiving vaccinations. Vaccinations for staff are also underway.

Revera will continue to do everything we can to keep our residents and employees safe as we work to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at our long term care homes and retirement residences.
