



**Media Statement – Update on outbreak at ThorntonView Long Term Care Home - Oshawa

We received notice today from Durham Public Health that the Rosegarden, Corbett Court and the Trillium resident home areas have been declared out of COVID-19 outbreak. The Pinegrove home area remains in outbreak.

Since the outbreak was declared on November 28, Durham Public Health has confirmed that 92 residents of ThorntonView Long Term Care Home in Oshawa have tested positive for COVID-19. There are currently no residents with active cases of COVID-19. We regret to confirm that 25 residents of ThorntonView have passed away with COVID-19 since the outbreak began. Our team offers its most sincere condolences to the families and friends of the people who passed away.

Public Health also confirmed that 70 staff have tested positive for COVID-19. All 70 cases have now resolved.

We are working very closely with Public Health officials and are maintaining pandemic outbreak protocols and infection control practices. All residents are monitored twice daily for symptoms and are tested if they present any potential signs or symptoms of the virus.

All staff are screened at the beginning and end of their shifts and are being cohorted to work in assigned resident areas where possible. All staff are required to wear an appropriate mask and eye protection in the home, and additional personal protective equipment as required.

Enhanced cleaning is being done at ThorntonView. We frequently disinfect high touch surfaces like handrails and doors, common areas and staff rooms.

At the direction of Durham Public Health, all Pinegrove residents are to remain in their rooms at all times. Individual recreation activities will be continued to maintain social engagement during this period of isolation.

ThorntonView residents who have consented to and are able to be vaccinated have begun to receive their first doses. Vaccinations for staff are also underway.



We are regularly updating residents, their families and staff of the status of the outbreak. At the direction of Public Health, visits are restricted to essential caregivers and essential visits for palliative residents.

We recognize how difficult these measures are for residents and their families and we appreciate their patience and understanding as we put these precautions in place for the safety of our residents.

Revera continues to do everything we can to keep our residents and employees safe as we work to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at our long term care homes and retirement residences.
