



**Media Statement – Update on Stoneridge Manor Long Term Care Home, Carleton Place
– Dr. Rhonda Collins, Chief Medical Officer, Revera**

May 25, 2020

Since our last update, one additional resident at Stoneridge Manor Long Term Care Home in Carleton Place has tested positive for COVID-19, for a total of 53 positive tests for residents during the outbreak. Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health considers 46 of the residents to be recovered, the others remain in isolation. Among staff, 29 have tested positive in total, and 20 have recovered and returned to work. The remaining 9 are in isolation at home.

We are very sad to confirm that we have had 6 residents pass away with COVID-19, the most recent being April 27. We offer our most sincere condolences to the families and friends of the people we have lost to this pandemic.

We continue working very closely with Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit and are following pandemic outbreak protocols and infection control practices. All residents are monitored closely for symptoms and all staff are screened at the beginning and end of their shifts. Staff providing care for residents in isolation (positive or symptomatic) wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) which includes a mask, face shield, gloves and gown. All staff are required to wear a surgical mask in the residence at all times.

We are doing enhanced cleaning at Stoneridge Manor, using extra housekeeping staff to do more frequent cleaning. High touch areas like common areas and staff rooms are being disinfected using a Clorox 360 Disinfectant Cleaner system.

To promote physical distancing, residents are being served their meals in their rooms and group recreation programming has been replaced by one-on-one activities with residents for social engagement.

We are reaching out to families of residents as often as possible to provide updates on their loved ones during this time of physical isolation.

Revera continues to do everything we can to keep our residents and employees safe as we work to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at our long term care homes and retirement residences.
