



**Media Statement – Outbreak at Stoneridge Manor Long Term Care Home, Carleton Place
– Dr. Rhonda Collins, Chief Medical Officer, Revera**

November 1, 2020

Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health today declared an outbreak of COVID-19 after one staff member at Stoneridge Manor Long Term Care Home in Carleton Place tested positive for COVID-19 during regular surveillance testing. The staff member is at home in self-isolation.

We are working closely with Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health officials and following pandemic outbreak protocols and enhanced infection control practices. Residents are isolated to their rooms and are monitored closely for symptoms twice daily. All staff are screened at the beginning and end of their shifts and are required to wear appropriate masks and eye protection.

We are doing enhanced cleaning at Stoneridge Manor, frequently disinfecting high touch surfaces like handrails and doors, resident rooms, common areas and staff rooms.

Residents will receive meals in their rooms while allowing staff to provide supervision and assistance as required. Group recreation programs have been replaced by individual activities to maintain social engagement.

We have notified residents, their families and the staff of the status of the outbreak and will continue to update them regularly. Per Public Health direction, all indoor and outdoor visits have been cancelled. Essential caregivers and essential visitors to palliative residents will continue.

Revera continues to do everything we can to keep our residents and employees safe as we work to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at our long term care homes and retirement residences.
