Following is a summary of the current public health-directed rules about visiting in each province in which Revera operates, as of October 19, 2020. **For full and specific visitation guidelines at each home or residence, please connect directly with the Executive Director. Please remember to follow ALL visitation guidelines, which are designed to help keep our residents and staff safe.**

Alberta

	Not in outbreak	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each resident can name up to two Designated Family/Support Persons (DFSP) • Physical distancing guidelines must be maintained at all times <p>Indoor Visits</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only the DFSPs are allowed indoor visits • Visitors are required to wear a mask at all times in the Residence and will be screened upon entry <p>Outdoor Visits</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The DFSP is not required to be present for the outdoor visit. • The residence can accommodate a maximum of five (5) visitors. • A designated outdoor visiting space will be made available for the visit.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continuous use of mask is not required for outdoor visits unless physical distancing cannot be maintained. • Entry inside the residence is not permitted
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British Columbia

Facility staff/operator can approve a change to the designated visitor under extenuating circumstances (e.g. visitor moves away, becomes ill or is unable to visit) • Visits must be scheduled in advance to ensure appropriate staffing and physical distancing • Visitors will be screened upon arrival • All visitors should adhere to physical distancing guidelines and are required to wear a face covering at all times (visitors are required to wear a medical grade mask as some Health Authorities require the use of such a mask) • Essential visitors do not need to schedule visit in advance. Only one essential care visitor at a time with exception of EOL/palliative where more than one at a time may be permitted

Please keep in mind physical distancing guidelines when determining the number of visitors in the suite • Outdoor visits occur in a designated space with physical distancing guidelines in mind • Visits are to be scheduled in advance to ensure appropriate staffing • Visitors will be screened on arrival • All visitors must adhere to physical distancing guidelines and are required to wear a face

	Not in outbreak and in an area that has not been identified as having higher community spread	<p>Essential caregivers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Each resident may designate up to two essential caregivers. Essential caregivers may visit together or separately at any time, for any duration. If the resident is self-isolating or symptomatic, a maximum of one caregiver may visit at a time. <p>General visitors</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Up to two general visitors may visit a resident at once Visits must be scheduled in advance to ensure appropriate staffing and physical distancing

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each resident may have at least one 30-minute visit per week • No general visitors are permitted for residents who are self-isolating or symptomatic • Visitors must maintain physical distancing at all times, including from the person they are visiting <p>Indoor vs. outdoor visits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Indoor visitors must attest to having a negative COVID-19 within the previous 14 days, without a subsequent positive test. • COVID-19 test not required for outdoor visits • Indoor visitors must wear personal protective equipment including a surgical/procedural mask • Outdoor visitors must bring their own face covering (cloth/homemade masks are fine) <p>All visitors:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visitors must pass active screening for COVID-19 when they arrive • Caregivers must not visit any other resident or home for 14 days after visiting a home in an outbreak or a resident who is self-isolating or symptomatic.
Retirement	In outbreak or residences which are in a high alert area	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Essential visitors only. The Ministry of Health recently changed the definition of and guidelines for essential visitors in Retirement. You can read the full directive here.
	Not in outbreak	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visits may occur inside or outside the residence, however we are recommending all visits (where possible) take place outdoors • Number of visitors and length of visit is up to the individual residence • Visits must be scheduled in advance in order to ensure appropriate staffing and physical distancing • Visitors must pass active screening for COVID-19 when they arrive • Physical distancing must be maintained at all times • For outdoor visits, visitors must bring their own face covering (cloth/homemade mask/covering

		are fine). For indoor visits, the face mask must be medical or surgical grade (as per the Chief Medical Officer of Health directives). Masks must be worn at ALL times for the duration of the visit.

	Not in outbreak	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each resident can identify one support person and up to five designated visitors • A maximum of two people can visit per day; and two visitors can attend at the same time • Visits can take place inside or outside; Indoor visits must take place in the resident’s suite • Visits must be coordinated with the residence • Essential visitors are required to provide photo ID, sanitize their hands and will be screened upon entry (temperature check and questionnaire) • Physical distancing must be maintained at all times
