



**Media Statement – Update on outbreak at Parkview Place Long Term Care Home – Winnipeg

Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WRHA) has informed us that a second staff member of Parkview Place has tested positive for COVID-19. The two employees who have tested positive remain at home in self-isolation. The facility is conducting contact tracing. Further testing for residents and staff may be undertaken as indicated.

We were also informed that four additional residents tested positive, or a total of eleven residents who have tested positive, including one person who passed away. The team at Parkview Place offers their most sincere condolences to the family and friends of the person who was lost to the pandemic.

We continue to work closely with WRHA Public Health officials to implement pandemic outbreak protocols and enhanced infection control practices. All residents are remaining on their floors. Positive cases are in isolation in their rooms. All residents are monitored closely for symptoms twice daily. Staff are screened at the beginning and end of their shifts. All staff continue to wear the indicated PPE which includes an appropriate mask, gloves and eye protection in the home when in contact with residents.

We are doing enhanced cleaning at Parkview Place, disinfecting high touch surfaces like handrails and doors, resident rooms, common areas and staff rooms more frequently.

At the direction of Public Health, we have adjusted our mealtime and recreation activities. We have closed the main dining room. Residents are served meals on their floors while allowing the staff to provide supervision and assistance as required. Residents who have tested positive are served meals in their rooms. Group recreation programs have been replaced by one-on-one activities to maintain social engagement.

We will continue to provide updates for residents, their families and the staff of the status of the outbreak.

Revera continues to do everything we can to keep our residents and employees safe as we work to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at our long term care homes and retirement residences.
