“We love having dogs move in to our retirement communities with their owners,” says Stephen Foster, Chief Operating Officer, Revera. “There is a myth out there that people can’t bring their dogs with them when they move to a retirement community. “There is a growing body of literature to show the importance of the human-animal bond and increasing evidence of the health and social benefits of pets,” says Greg Shaw, Director, International and Corporate Relations, IFA. “With the number of older persons expected to more than double globally, from 841 million people in 2013 to more than 2 billion in 2050, we need to look at the role pets can play in keeping people mentally and physically healthy.” The report highlights studies that show pet owners have lower blood pressure and cholesterol levels. Interacting with animals has also been reported to increase self-esteem and life satisfaction.

A variety of dog-friendly events are being held at Revera retirement communities across the country on August 26th. They include dog fashion shows, dog-themed parties—complete with complimentary dog grooming services, pet adoption opportunities with local animal shelters and even visits from therapy dogs.
